Badin Overview

Badin district is the tail of Pakistan with a population of about 1.3 m in the far south of the country. Because of its location as the last destination all water flows in the upper and lower Sindh and vulnerable to torrential rains of the Indian coastal line it is vulnerable to the damages caused by heavy monsoon rains and as is the most badly affected district by heavy rains.

Main left bank out fall drain passes from Badin so it brings agricultural and industrial drain water from whole of Sindh into the district. During heavy rains these drains overflow or breaches occur, as the water flows into the crops and villages causing population displacement, housing damages, food and health problems for the local communities.

The rain started on 9th August and continued for 46 hours continuously without any pause, which disrupted the normal life of the District. There are 05 Talukas in the district i.e. Badin, Golarchi, Tando Bago, Talhar and Matli, as Badin, Tando Bago and Golarchi are badly hit by recent rains. A total of 414 relief camps have been established by revenue department in the district till filing of the report, as there are some spontaneous camps in affected areas, not designated officially. In these camps a total of 144,712 people are residing (25,115 families, 29,073 males, 30,411 females and 85,228 children).

Current Situation After Heavy Rainfall

According to Notational Weather Forecasting Centre that District Badin is under heavy torrential rains since last three days & highly effected with MOON SOON. Heavy Rain and amount of rainfall was recoded on August 11, 2011 was 212 mm in Badin district and moon soon rains are predicted for next few days more.

The heavy rainfall and associated other causes i.e. breaches in canals, Sim Nala's, roads under water have badly affected to 15 union council of four talukas of Badin i.e. Shaheed Fazil Rahu, Tando Bago, Badin and some union councils of Taluka Talhar. In each Taluka & union councils most of the villages have come under water devastating the infrasturacture of roads, water, drains & canals. It has also been reported that some kucha & Pakka houses have also been collapses & badly damaged. Recent heavy rains have mostly damaged the agriculture sector.

Approximately affected population of four Taluka is four hundred thousand. It might be possible that a large number of local communities migrate to the safer places. In this regard district government initially established 58 camps in the various spots of the district for the expected IDPs and the large population about 15000 people has been shifted to the Government buildings but many of them are sitting under open sky on the embankments of the canals and roads.

Priority Needs

- There is need of safe drinking water and improvement in sanitary conditions, as in the absence of safe drinking water and proper sanitary conditions there is a high chance of disease outbreaks, particularly of AWD and other waterborne diseases.
- Heat stroke is another condition that could be provoked in such congested settings and lack of aeration and cooling facilities.
- Due to heavy rains and emergence of snakes, cases of snake bite may increase so there is an urgent need for ASV supply.
- Congestion in the camps can facilitate outbreak of skin diseases like scabies as the anti-scabies drugs need to be available in the camps (in the medical camps visited it was available).
- Stagnant water will allow suitable breeding sites for mosquitoes and thus increase the incidence of malaria. Therefore mosquito nets, anti malarial drugs and RDTs will be required.
- In this rainy season there are chances of dengue fever for which isolated rooms and supportive therapy elements will be needed.
